Carlos Ordonez Vargos served 18 years in the Army, mostly in Special Forces, rising through the ranks to Master Sergeant, Team Leader, and eventually an Instructor. Vargos desired a military career but sensed God had another call on his life. When the Army sent him to a psychiatric hospital, he took it as a sign from the Lord. "I survived a lot of death. I am a walking pure miracle of God. God is the only one that could have saved me from the things I survived," Vargos explains. Vargos had been coping with PTSD as well as some bodily injuries for several years before taking medical retirement in 2019.

God had been working on Vargos' next mission for decades "I view myself through the story of Cornelius," Vargos explains, referring to a Roman soldier in Acts 10-11. "I had been looking to know who this God was, and to know Him and have a relationship with Him." In 2012, Farid Awad, an Army Chaplain, and former Manna University professor, spent a year studying the book of Romans with Vargos. "It was Farid giving me a biblical Gospel that really turned my life around. I understood how much of a sinner I was and what the consequences were," Vargos recalls. "From that moment, my life changed significantly." As his Army career ended, he began working toward a degree at Manna U. "I have nothing but great things to say about all the professors," he remarked with great enthusiasm. Vargos still had numerous physical and psychological struggles, but Manna U was committed to his success. "As long as I maintained communication, the instructors were always extremely helpful, even praying for me. It has been nothing but a blessing." When asked about a favorite class or instructor, Vargos had trouble choosing. "I love reading the Bible...and I needed to find the right way of studying it, so Hermeneutics gave me that. It really transformed the way I read the Bible."

Even after a year of studying with Farid Awad, Vargos found more from his Mexico and Colombia with Carlos serving as a Teaching Assistant Manna U course Book of Romans."It wasn't until I took that course that everything just fit so perfectly," Vargos notes. He credits the Kingdom of God course with helping him see where he fits in God's ultimate plan, giving him clarity for how to approach other courses. During the time he was meeting with Awad, Vargos and his wife Esperanza formulated a plan students. "Let God be God. God uses Manna U so beautifully. He to start an orphanage near her family in Aguascalientes Mexico, where unwanted children are routinely abandoned. They soon discovered, however, that God's plan was for the spiritually orphaned people.



started by Esperanza's family and is slowly changing minds and hearts. "We were presenting the Bible, they were taking it through their own interpretation rather than what the Bible actually says." To help address this concern, Vargos has spearheaded a move by Manna U to help him bring the Gospel to the unreached in Latin America. "Having Latin American students at Manna U has been so fulfilling. Manna U has been part of the help in discipling them," Vargos explains. Manna U Latin America now has 25 students in in several of the classes. Vargos feels a clear call to the work in Mexico. He spends up to three months per year in Mexico and stays connected remotely as he is able. Vargos, of the Manna U Class of 2023, shares a word of advice for current and future Manna U reveals Himself through the instructors themselves and the materials we use. For me that is all I wanted, to know more of who God is. I just wanted to know the God I had been chasing for all my


